Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Anderson

I, Mrs. Louisa Camp do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of B. W. Camp deceased, who departed this life on the 5th day of Sept, A. D. 1908, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 21 day of Feb, A. D. 1877, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas

My husband, the said BW Camp, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States and he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State of the United States, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? All her life

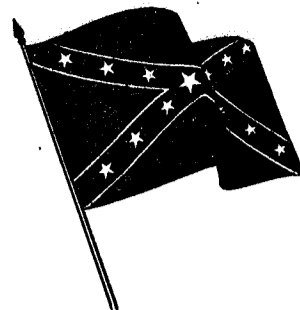

Dear Sir:

I am today mailing to Mrs. Louisa Camp a pension warrant addressed to Palestine, Texas. These warrants have heretofore been mailed to Route 1, Box 44A, Palestine, Texas.

I have a request from Mrs. Camp to mail her warrant in care of the cashier of the I. & G. N. Freight Office, Palestine. From this information, I am sure you will be able to get the address to which place the warrant can be delivered to Mrs. Camp in person.

Our instructions are that pension warrants should not be mailed in care of corporations or individuals except where it is absolutely necessary, as such persons sometimes forward the warrants, many times sending them out of the State to pensioners who have temporarily left the State and remain away a greater length of time than that allowed by law and yet draw a pension. It is for this reason that I am writing you this letter of explanation.
